#### **SCHOOL READINESS PROGRAM**

The School Readiness Program engages families, community members and educators in the important work of preparing children, from birth to age 5, for kindergarten. Through a partnership formed with selected local elementary schools, the SR Program funds and coordinates Summer Kinder school programs in addition to Family Health and Community Resource Fairs. The Family Resource Fairs bring community programs and governmental agencies together to promote awareness of their services and to provide valuable resources to parents and families.

#### **CHILD SIGNATURE PROGRAM**

The Child Signature Program will assist preschool agencies within catchment areas with an Academic Performance Index score between 1-3. The program's Early Learning Specialist will work with the preschools' combined 30 classrooms, and complete a Readiness Assessment. The Child Signature Program will facilitate trainings to preschool teachers using the Early Education Effectiveness Exchange (E4) to increase their skills and knowledge, and to support their educational goals.


# PROFESSIONAL ADVANCEMENT FOR CHILDHOOD EDUCATORS STIPEND (PACES)
